Site	Location	Description
Henry A. Spencer, Childhood Home	Village of Albion; Chamberlain Street	1 st African American Student at University of Rochester, pall bearer for Frederick Douglass funeral, member of Frederick Douglass Memorial Committee; NYS Assembly Sec.
Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church	Village of Albion; Brown Street	1st Polish rural mission church outside of Buffalo, center of Albion's Polonia
George Pullman Home	Village of Albion; E. State Street	
Silas Mainville Burroughs Home	Village of Medina; State Street Park	S.M. Burroughs Sr., NYS Assemblyman, Member 35 th /36 th Congress; S.M. Burroughs Jr., founder of Burroughs Wellcome & Co., now GlaxoSmithKline
Carlyon Calamity	Town of Carlton; Yates-Carlton Townline	Site of railroad accident on R.W.&O. Railroad, caused deaths of 17 passengers
Stangeland Property	Town of Kendall; Norway Road	Site of Andreas Stangeland Home, traveled w/ Cleng Peerson in 1824 to select land for Sloopers, remained with Norwegians as Peerson traveled westward
Bidelman's Tannery	Town of Gaines; Ridge Road near Rt. 279	Originally Mather's Tannery, Masons allegedly stopped at site while transporting the kidnapped William Morgan to Lewiston
Brady's Quarry	Town of Albion; Butts Road near Canal	Site allegedly provided sandstone for the Capitol Building in Albany (need to confirm location)
Sgt. Isaac Hawkins Home	Village of Medina; Near Glenwood & Ryan Streets	African-American, member of 54 th Massachusetts Infantry, captured at Battle of Olustee, Prisoner at Andersonville, buried at Arlington National Cemetery
Lake Alice	Town of Carlton	Man-made lake, constructed by Western New York Utilities Co. in 1917, purchased over 50 parcels of property, relocated buildings to create reservoir.
Wilson Hanging	Village of Albion; Court House Square	Site of only execution in Orleans County
